

# My Community



Antigua, Guatemala

I live in Antigua, Guatemala. It's a small, historical city surrounded by mountains and volcanoes located in southeastern Guatemala. This charming city with cobblestone streets and colorful buildings was once the Spanish capital of Central America and has been designated a UNESCO World Heritage site. Many tourists visit Antigua every year, but the people that live here make it special. I will share about the two ethnic groups who live in Antigua.



About 50,000 people live in Antigua. Most of the residents are Ladino, a mixed race with indigenous and Spanish ancestry. Many of the Ladino people in Antigua work in the hospitality industry at hotels, restaurants and shops in the city. They also work as bus drivers and tour guides. Other Ladinos in Antigua have careers in healthcare, education or agriculture. About 80% of Ladino children attend school. Ladinos are usually catholic and attend church on Sunday. Some Ladinos have a lot of money and some live in poverty, but I think most Ladinos in Antigua work hard and live comfortably.



A small population of Maya people also live in Antigua. They make up about 10–15% of the population. The Maya are the indigenous people of Guatemala who have lived here for centuries. Regrettably, they are not as fortunate as the Ladino population because they have faced years of oppression. The Maya usually work on farms or sell traditional gifts in the city. Many Maya people live in poverty and about half of Maya children do not attend school. The Maya practice their own religious rituals and are passionate about preserving their culture.



I believe both Ladino and Maya people make Antigua a special place to live. We all contribute to our city's rich history and charming atmosphere. I hope we can all go to school, follow our dreams and live comfortably. My dream is for all of us to work together to make Antigua an even safer and more prosperous city. I hope you can come visit one day and meet the beautiful people of Antigua.


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#### Social Research Questionnaire
