A	<p style="text-align: center;">My Name is...</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Show each student how to write their name on a small white board or scratch paper. Students choose a color crayon and write their name in their book. Then draw their picture in the big box. 	Stories Book
1	<p style="text-align: center;">Colors</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Use the colors flashcards. Hold up a card and say the color. Point to different things in the room that are that color and say (Blue! It's a blue shirt.)etc. Sing, "I See Something Blue" & "I See Something Pink" Super Simple Songs. Run around the room and point to different colors as you sing. 	Colors Flashcards
1	<p style="text-align: center;">Color Nature Cards Karuta</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Show the students some of the color nature cards. Say the colors on the cards together. Then place all the cards face up on the floor. Have the students touch the wall on 1 side of the room. Call out a color and count down from 5 or ten. The students try to find a card with the color you called out. If they find a card they show you (the teacher) and say the color and the item (green iguana / red apples) They keep the card as a point. Keep playing until all of the nature cards are gone 	Color Nature Cards
2	<p style="text-align: center;">Numbers</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Look at the numbers on page 2 or hold up the flashcards. Say each number together as you touch it (in the book) or hold up the card. Sing a numbers song (recommend: 0-5-10 Elf Learning) If you have time to play a game (ideas listed at bottom of guide) 	Numbers Cards

	<p style="text-align: center;">Color Nature Cards Karuta</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Play colors Karuta again.2. When your finished with the game, sit in a circle and call out a color. Have the students find the card that they found and give it to you. Say all of the words together with the students. (red apples, red flowers, a red bird..)	Color Nature Cards
	<p style="text-align: center;">Color Your Garden</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Print out the My Garden coloring sheet for each student.2. Color one of your flowers and say it's a red flower/tulip.3. Then let your students color their gardens.4. Have your students say the color flower they are coloring.5. Finally, share your garden with the class by pointing to each flower and saying, "This is a red flower. This is a purple flower." etc.6. Have your students take turns and share their gardens. 	<p style="text-align: center;">SING!</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Sing, "I See Something Blue" & "I See Something Pink" Super Simple Songs. Run around the room and point to different colors as you sing. Sing a numbers song (recommend: 0-5-10 Elf Learning) 	
	<p style="text-align: center;">Numbers Game</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Play one of the recommended numbers games listed below or your favorite numbers game. 	Numbers Cards
2	<p style="text-align: center;">Numbers BINGO</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Cut out the number dot cards. Glue them to colored paper and place them face down or put them in a box for students to draw. Open books to page 2. Draw a card and count the dots on the card. Find the number in your book and circle it. Split the class into teams. Each team draws a card and counts the dots. Then finds the number in their books and circles it. Keep going until a team finds all the numbers and gets BINGO! 	Number Dot Cards Stories Book

Numbers Games:

- Numbers Jump (Best for big classrooms or outdoors): Have all the students stand on one side of the room. Hold up a flashcard. The students say the number. Then they jump towards you and count along until they reach the number of the card you held up.
*Example: (You hold up 6) Students all yell out 6. Then jump towards you 6 times while counting, "1,2,3,4,5,6!"
Keep going until one of the kids gets to you. Or you can yell RUN! and all the students can run back to the other side of the room or the safe zone.
- Number Blocks (If you have blocks or anything else to stack): Hold up a number. Then set a timer and have the students try to stack that many blocks before the timer goes out. Students count aloud every number as they stack.
- Or your favorite number game. There are so many!

	<p style="text-align: center;">BUGS</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Teach the bugs with flashcards 	Bugs Flashcards
	<p style="text-align: center;">BUG Hide and Seek</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Show the students how to close their eyes and count to ten. 2. Now while they are closing their eyes quickly hide the bug cards in the classroom. 3. Have them open their eyes and look for the bugs. If they find a card, they say, " I see a beetle." 4. Next, split the class into teams. One team hides the cards and the other team counts. Then rotate. 	Bugs Flashcards
3-4	<p style="text-align: center;">Bugs: Find & Count Activity</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Open your books to pages 3&4. 2. Point to a bug at the top of the page. Have the students say the bug name in English. Then find all the bugs on the page and count together. 3. Students can write how many of each bug they find above the box (or not) 	Stories Book

Let the students choose what bug they want to color. Then ask for the color crayon they want to use. 3. When they finish coloring a bug, they cut it out. 4. Say tip toe and have them tip toe forward while also saying tip toe. 3. Yell out "STOP!" Whoever moves has to start over. 4. Keep playing by using all of the movements from the book on page 30.

	<p style="text-align: center;">SING!</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Sing, "Walking, Walking (Super Simple Songs). 2. Watch, Sing & Move along to "Crawl Like a Caterpillar" (Super Simple Songs) 	
	<p style="text-align: center;">Review Number & Color Games</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Choose a game or 2 that the students like to review numbers and colors. 	Number or Color Game Materials
	<p style="text-align: center;">Colorful Bug Hunt</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Hold up the different bugs the students colored and say the color and the name of the bug together. 2. Put the bugs the students colored around the room. 3. Stand up and have the students form a line behind you. (You can make a train chop chop sound so they understand that they are making a train.) 4. Start walking and sing, "We're going on a bug hunt" and have the students repeat after you. After you sing, "Shh be quiet. 1,2,3..." Point to a bug in the classroom and say "LOOK" Have the students say the name of the bug. We see a ...! 5. Keep going around the room. 6.
